3. Students can complete the clinical nursing sequence for the BSN degree in 2 semesters and complete the MSN Clinical Specialist or Nursing Informatics Specialist in 4 additional semesters or complete the Family Nurse Practitioner in 5 additional semesters

Note: A minimum of 12 semester hours of general studies courses must be completed in the Troy University System to meet graduation requirements (May include 3 hrs of NSG 3315) . All other general studies courses may be complete at other colleges and universities. See Registrar for course equivalents.

RN to BSN/MSN Application Procedures

Step 1: Admission to the RN-BSN/MSN Track

- Submit Application for Admission to Undergraduate Study with a \$30.00 university application fee. (The University Application fee is not necessary if you have previously paid a university application fee to any Troy University campus).
- Submit Step 1 Application for Admission to RN to BSN/MSN Track/School of Nursing with a \$20.00 application fee. (Required for all students enrolling in nursing programs).
- Submit complete Student Medical History Record form (Required only for students attending classes on the Troy campus).
- Official transcripts from all colleges attended must be submitted directly from the institution of attendance.
- Submit three letters of professional reference (use enclosed forms).
- Overall GPA for all college work attempted of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
- ASN or Diploma graduate of an accredited nursing program.
- Proof of current, unencumbered RN license in state of clinical practice.
- Ability to perform core performance standards for admission and progression.
- All required documentation listed above must be on file in the Office of Admissions and Records no later than February 1, April 1 or September 1. It is the student's responsibility to verify that all documentation is on file with the Office of Admissions and Records. Incomplete files will not be evaluated by the School of Nursing for admission.
- Students will be notified of admission status by March 1, May 15, or October 1.

Step 2: Request for Progression to the Clinical Nursing Sequence

- Submit Step 2 Request for Progression to the Clinical Nursing Sequence Form to academic advisor by April 1. Progression criteria requirements include the following:
 - * General Studies requirements with a grade of 'C' or better in specified courses [Courses marked * on page 2 require a 'C' or better.]
 - * Official Academic Evaluation with overall cumulative GPA for all college work attempted of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
 - * Students may have a maximum of 9 hours of general studies that are lacking prior to beginning the clinical nursing sequence. These 9 hours are limited to the following courses: Literature, Art/Music/Drama, TROY 1101, History, and Ethics. Note: All general studies course requirements must be completed prior to entering the following courses: NSG 4430, NSG 4431, NSG 6691. Note: students may take NSG 3315 Pathophysiology with NSG 4430, NSG 4431, NSG 6691.
 - * Proof of current, unencumbered RN license in state of clinical practice.
- All required documentation listed above for the Request for Progression to the Clinical Nursing Sequence must be on file in the Academic Advisors Office no later than April 1. It is the student's responsibility to verify that all documentation is on file in the Academic Advisor's Office. **NOTE: The Clinical Nursing Sequence begins once a year in Fall Semester.**

Step 3: Progression to MSN Program

- Successful completion of all coursework in Semester I and II (awarded BSN).
- Acceptable MAT or GRE score (see Graduate Bulletin under School of Nursing).
- Overall GPA for all college work attempted of 2.5 on 4.0 scale (see Graduate Bulletin under School of Nursing).
- Minimum of one year clinical experience as a Registered Nurse (FNP program only).
- Application for the MSN Program should be on file in the Office of Admissions and Records at least one month prior to the beginning of the desired start term. It is the student's responsibility to verify that all required documentation for admission to the MSN program has been received by the Office of Admissions and Records.

Clinical Requirements:

All students who enroll in a clinical nursing course (NSG 4406 or NSG 4431) must have current, written documentation on file in the School of Nursing that includes the following clinical requirements:

- Professional Liability insurance (must purchase professional liability insurance through Troy University School of Nursing).
- Proof of certification in BCLS.
- Proof of current health insurance.
- Proof of annual physical examination with TB skin test results on a School of Nursing form.
- Proof of OSHA training.
- Results of serum titers for measles, mumps, rubella, and varicella zoster and evidence of immunity to Hepatitis B or proof of beginning Hepatitis B vaccinations series.
- A negative result on the Drug Screening certified by Lab Corp and Troy University School of Nursing Medical Review Officer.

BSN Clinical Nursing Sequence Progression Policy

- Students are required to make a grade of C or better in each required nursing course.
- Students may repeat only one nursing course listed in the BSN Clinical Nursing Sequence; thereafter, a D or F in any of these nursing courses will result in automatic dismissal from the program. This policy applies whether or not students have been accepted or admitted to the BSN Clinical Nursing Sequence. This policy does not apply to NSG 3315, Pathophysiology, or NSG 3340, Ethics in Nursing.
- Students who drop or fail a theory or clinical course which has a co-requisite component must drop the co-requisite course.
- Students must maintain current CPR certification, professional liability insurance, proof of annual physical exams and health insurance when enrolled in clinical nursing courses.
- Students in the School of Nursing must comply with legal, moral, and legislative standards in accordance with the Alabama Board of Nursing Administrative Code.
