

HOMECOMING QUEEN/KING RULES 2009

1. Campaign rules will be enforced as stated below. All information concerning the election rules come from the office of the Clerk of the Student Government Association. Contact Liz Dowe at sgavote@troy.edu.
2. A candidate may begin campaigning when the application is turned in.
3. If the candidate fails to meet any of the application criteria, the candidate is ineligible and all campaigning for the candidate must cease.
4. Information detailing times and locations of election events and application deadlines can be found on the official Homecoming schedule in the Homecoming packet.
5. If any mailings are distributed through the Post Office, it must be distributed to the post office boxes no less than 48 hours prior to the election with written permission from the Student Involvement Office in the Trojan Center Room 215.
6. Temporary or permanent marks may not be made on any campus property. This includes but is not limited to, paint, sidewalk chalk, markers, etc.
7. Candidates must have earned a minimum of 30 credit hours at Troy University and a Troy University minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 as stated on transcript.
8. Candidates must be full-time student in good-standing with Troy University.
9. Campaign rules will be enforced as stated in the Student Government Association Constitution and Code of Laws. Please see Oracle.
10. Court members must attend the Homecoming pep rally, Homecoming court dinner, parade, and game wearing business attire to each.
11. All candidates will be required to follow any additional regulations that may be imposed at the time the candidate submits application.
12. The top five candidates receiving the most votes on October 6, 2009 will be the Homecoming Courts. The top court candidates receiving the most votes on October 14, 2009 will be the Homecoming Queen/King.
13. In event of a tie, the placement of candidates in the first election (Tuesday, October 6, 2009) will determine the winner. The members of the Homecoming Court who tied in the second election, but had the most votes in the first election will be the Homecoming Queen/King.
14. All campaign laws and violations are subject to the regulation of the Clerk who shall be assisted by the Director of Elections.
15. All candidates for Homecoming Queen/King must be a TROY-Troy University main campus Student.
16. Any candidate found in violation of the aforementioned rules and regulations will be subject to the punishment including disqualification. The executive committee of the Student Government Association shall decide if a violation occurred and what punishment, if any, shall be prescribed.
17. **Organizations should be very careful to nominate a student who has given their time and service to Troy University, as well as someone who has represented the university and their organization in an outstanding manner.**
18. Each organization recognized by Troy University may only nominate one male for Homecoming King and also, one female for Homecoming Queen
