Points will be distributed in the following manner for events during the week of Homecoming:

Homecoming Meetings:

15 points – Each group is required to send one representative to the mandatory meetings. The group will meet two times before Homecoming week. Both meetings are mandatory in order to receive the 15 points. No partial points will be awarded. To receive all 15 points, both meetings must be attended.

Banner Competition:

20 points (Participation)

75 points added (1st Place); 60 points added (2nd Place); 45 points added (3rd Place)

Dance Competition:

20 points (Participation)

75 points added (1st Place); 60 points added (2nd Place); 45 points added (3rd Place)

Skit Competition:

20 points (Participation);

75 points added (1st Place); 60 points added (2nd Place); 45 points added (3rd Place)

Parade Float:

20 points (Participation);

90 points added (1st Place); 80 points added (2nd Place); 70 points added (3rd Place)

Campus Crawl:

25 points (5% of Organization Participation)

Teams may compete in one division throughout the duration of Homecoming week. If two organizations choose to compete together, they must compete together as one team in all events.

Official Homecoming Rules

General Rules

1. Any organization wishing to participate in Homecoming activities for 2009 will complete all proper forms and pay all necessary fees as listed in the application. Fees and applications are to be fully completed and returned to the Student Government Association office by 4 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 1, 2009. All fees are due at this time to confirm participation eligibility without penalty; no exceptions will be made.
2. If a Homecoming King or Queen application is turned in late, under no circumstances will that application be accepted. In order to run for Homecoming King or Queen, the application must be turned in on time and all qualifications must be met.
3. If a group fails to turn in their Homecoming Application on time, they may still participate in an event; however, they will be penalized with a five point deduction for each event registered tardy.
4. All decisions made by the Vice President of Campus Activities and Homecoming Director are final. They may be appealed in writing through due process to the Student Government Association President who will then present them to the Supreme Court for voting if deemed necessary. The appeal must be made within 24 hours of the decision in question and must be submitted in writing by the party from which the complaint originates. A complaint form is included in this packet.
5. Any organization or team disqualified for any reason during any event may become disqualified from participation in the remainder of the week's events. This decision will be under the discretion of the SGA executive council, which includes the President, Vice President of Campus Activities, Vice President of Legislative Affairs, Secretary and Clerk.
6. Individuals participating in competitive Homecoming events must be affiliated directly with the group they are competing with.
7. SGA senators may in no way affiliate or participate with an organization when working a Homecoming event as an SGA senator.
8. All members of the Executive Branch or Supreme Court of the SGA having ties or affiliations with any team or organization that is participating in Homecoming activities must disaffiliate with that or those organizations throughout the competition period, which begins Monday, October 19, 2009 at 7 a.m. and extends through the completion of all competitive activities.

HOMECOMING 2009

Official Homecoming Rules

General Rules: Tie

1. There will be no ties among first, second or third place winners in any of the Homecoming events.
2. If after the judges initial tabulations, there is a tie determined among any number of competitive groups, the judges will be asked to assign a number 1 through 5 (1 being the lowest and 5 being the highest) to each group in the tie. An average will be taken of the scores and the highest of those will receive the higher place in competition.
3. If further complications arise, the Vice President of Campus Activities and Homecoming Director reserve the right to improvise all necessary procedures to allow the judges to break the tie before points are awarded and announced.

General Rules: Wristbands

1. Wristbands will only be used for Dance and Skit competitions. Those participating in each competition will receive a wristband for themselves and one for a parent.
2. Each organization participating in ANY Homecoming activities will be given a percent of wristbands based on the size of their organization.
3. Along with a wristband, individuals must also bring ONE CANNED FOOD ITEM for entrance into the dance competition.
4. Both dance and skit competitions begin at 7:00pm in Claudia Crosby Theater. If you have a wristband in your possession, but aren't seated by 7:00pm, your wristband will automatically be voided. (This is clearly stated on the wristband.)
5. Wristbands will be dispersed by VPCA Morgan Hooper and Homecoming Director Lisa McGonegle from 11:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. on Friday, October 16, 2009. All other wristbands are not eligible for use. If an organization is caught duplicating wristbands their wristbands will be confiscated and that organization will no longer be allowed to compete in ANY Homecoming activities.
6. Persons not in an organization may pick up a wristband in the SGA office on Friday October 16, 2009. These will be given as first come, first serve basis. These are only for student not in organizations participating in the competitions. Do not attempt to come to the SGA Office if your organization is competing in any Homecoming activities! Students picking up wristbands must present their Trojan ID.

Official Homecoming Rules Banner Competition

Monday, October 19, 2009
12:00 p.m. - 1:00 p.m.

1. Teams must use nothing larger than a Queen size sheet.
2. Each organization is responsible for using their own supplies and labor to hang their banner.
3. All banners must be hung between 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. on Monday, October 19, 2009. Failure to hang banner during this time will result in the organization being withdrawn from the banner competition portion of the Homecoming festivities. The organization may still hang their banner, but it will not be judged, nor will it receive participation points.
4. Banners will be hung on the west fence of the Riddle-Pace Field facing Pace Hall.
5. Judging will occur on Monday afternoon and results will be announced during the dance competition on Monday night at 7 p.m. in Claudia Crosby Theater.
6. Judging will be based solely upon the discretion of a judging panel. The VPCA and Homecoming Director will select the judging panel.
7. Judging criteria will be as follows:
 - a. Use of Homecoming 2009 Theme – 40%
 - b. Trojan Pride – 20%
 - c. Overall Appearance/ Aesthetic Appeal – 40%

Dance Competition

Monday, October 19, 2009

7:00 p.m. Claudia Crosby Theater

1. Each organization will have exactly one (1) minute to prepare themselves on stage for their performance. Each dance performance will be no longer than four (4) minutes. At the end of four (4) minutes, all movements and music on stage must cease. Curtains will close at the four minute mark. Failure to cease movement and music will result in immediate disqualification from dance competition.
2. No more than 15 participants will be allowed on stage during a team's performance.
3. Organizations must submit all music to be used during their performances as well as a list of participants at the mandatory Homecoming meeting, Friday, October 16, 2009.
4. All music and dance routines must be in good taste and may not in any way mention, allude to, or have any type of resemblance to any individual or organization without the written consent of the said individual or organization. This includes but is not limited to students, faculty, staff, administration, and any student organization.
5. Any type of footwear with metal on the sole may not be worn on the stage. This includes, but is not limited to cleats (including plastic cleats), tap shoes, and clogs.
6. The dance competition is strictly for dancing. There are no skit segments involved in the dance competition. The usage of such activities will result in point deduction, which is up to judges' discretion.
7. The use of free-standing props is prohibited.
8. The doors will be opened to the public at 6:30 p.m. No prior entrance to the facility will be allowed to anyone for any reason.
9. No balloons, flags, or any other objects that may hinder the viewing of dance performances may be brought into the theater.
10. No glitter in the theater.
11. Judges will base their decisions on dance routine content, Trojan pride and spirit, crowd appeal, and incorporation of the 2009 Homecoming Theme. The Vice President of Campus Activities and Homecoming Director will select the judging panel.
12. Violations of these rules will result in immediate disqualification from the event, loss of participation points, and possible disqualification from the remainder of the week's activities. Rule violations are solely subject to the Vice President of Campus Activities and Homecoming Director.

Official Homecoming Rules

Skit Competition
Wednesday, October 21st, 2009
7:00 p.m. Claudia Crosby Theater

1. No more than 15 participants shall be on the stage during the skit.
2. The actual skit performance will be no longer than three (3) minutes. Each organization will have exactly one (1) minute to prepare themselves on stage prior to their performance. Following the performance, each organization has one (1) minute to take down any props used.
3. At the end of the three (3) minutes designated for skit activity, all movement on stage must cease. Curtains will close at the three minute mark. Failure to cease movement will result in immediate disqualification from the skit competition.
4. Each organization will be responsible for picking up their skit material bags from the SGA office on Wednesday, October 21, 2009, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon. If an organization fails to pick up skit bag materials during the designated time, they may still participate. However, five points will be deducted from their overall score.
5. All skit content must be in good taste and may in no way mention, allude to, or have any type of resemblance to any individual or organization without the written consent of the said individual or organization. This includes, but is not limited to, students, faculty, staff, administration, and any student organization.
6. Any type of footwear with metal on the sole may not be worn on the stage. This includes, but is not limited to, cleats (including plastic cleats), tap shoes, and clogs.
7. The skit competition is strictly skit only. There will be no form of dance, music, or singing involved in the skit competition. The usage of such activity will result in point deduction, which is under judges' discretion.
8. Organizations should refrain from using violence, profanity, and/or vulgarity in routines.
9. The use of props is allowed; however, they must be put up and taken down in the time designated in rule (1).
10. No items may be thrown into the audience.
11. The doors will be opened to the public at 6:30 p.m. No prior entrance to the facility will be allowed to anyone for any reason.
12. No balloons, flags, or any other objects that may hinder the viewing of skit performances may be brought into the theater.
14. No glitter in the theater.
15. Judges will base their decision on skit content and overall affect, use of provided skit bag materials, Trojan pride and spirit, crowd appeal, and incorporation of the 2009 Homecoming theme. The Vice President of Campus Activities and Homecoming Director will select the judging panel.
16. Violations of these rules will result in immediate disqualification from the event, loss of participation points, and possible disqualification from the remainder of the week's activities. Rule violations are solely subject to the Vice President of Campus Activities and Homecoming Director.

Campus Crawl
Friday, October 23rd, 2009
3:00 p.m. Trojan Center

1. Organizations participating must have 5% of its members present at start time and involved in the Campus Crawl in order to receive full amount of points. The number of participants will be rounded to the nearest whole number.
 - a. Example: If an organization has 62 members, 5% would be 3.1. Therefore, this group must have 4 participants.
2. Organizations must pay \$15 entry fee and bring 10 pairs of socks per team by 4 p.m. on October 1, 2009. If more than 5% of members would like to participate in the race, they must pay the \$10 individual race fee.
3. Participants must follow route given by race director.
4. Participants must complete the entire 2 mile course between 3:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m. on the day of the competition.

Homecoming Parade
Saturday, October 24, 2009
10:00 a.m. Downtown Troy

1. Parade floats must be lined up at 8:30 a.m. on Saturday, October 24, 2009. Organizations will be notified of the parade order and location for lineup.
2. The parade will begin at 10:00 a.m. and proceed through downtown Troy.
3. Judges for the parade float competition will be selected by the VPCA and Homecoming Director.
4. Judging criteria includes overall appearance, Trojan pride and spirit, and innovative incorporation of the 2009 Homecoming Theme.
5. Under no circumstances will embarrassing, vulgar, or lewd material be permitted on floats that will degrade the image of Troy University.
6. No cigarettes, alcoholic beverages, smoking, or consumption of alcohol beverages will be allowed on parade floats.
7. If the weather is in question on Saturday morning, tune your radio to WTBF, FM 94.7 for information.
8. No items at all may be thrown from any parade unit. For example; No food, candy, or beads
9. There will be no time to stop for a performance. The parade must continue moving to remain on schedule.
10. Troy University organizations will be the only organizations allowed to use cars or pickups in the parade. All other organizations must adhere to the outlines given by the City of Troy Chamber of Commerce.
11. No couches or chairs will be allowed on floats unless the couch or chair is somehow incorporated into the float theme. Floats will not be allowed to participate in the parade if they consist solely of couches or chairs placed on a vehicle. This determination will be left to the discretion of the judges' panel, VPCA, and Homecoming Director

General Information

PARTICIPANTS:

Your entry must be related to Troy University. Your entry must be: a homemade float, a professional float, or an antique vehicle. This applies to all entries except Troy University organizations. If a unit is not one of the above, marshals will remove the unauthorized unit from the parade line-up. This does not apply to previously approved units.

FLOATS:

Riders on float, please go to Walt's Fitness Center parking lot (corner of Montgomery St. and South Three Notch St.) Be there by 8:15 a.m. Please report to the parade marshal, they will point you in the right direction.

INTERVAL:

30 yards between units. It is to your benefit to keep proper distance between units.
